

Bohemia for the Centennial

The people sang and danced... and above all enjoyed an exquisite evening in celebration of the second Bohemia. The event was organized by The University of Puerto Rico at Mayagüez's (UPRM) Centennial Celebration Committee, in collaboration with the Alumni Office. It took place last Friday, September 5, 2008, in the Bobby Cruz Convention Center in Hormigueros and was carried out with the intention of celebrating the UPRM's first one hundred years of existence. The chancellor of UPRM, Dr. Jorge Iván Vélez Arocho, maintained that events like the Bohemia help to solidify relations amongst everyone in the campus community.
