## Puerto Rico Teacher Specialization Certification Exam Results 2014-2016

The following table shows the passing rates of UPRM graduates on the Puerto Rico Teacher specialization certification exams over the past three years. The exams are offered on a Saturday in March of each calendar year. A subsequent table provides a year by year comparison and greater detail. With the exception of the Secondary Social Science or History Teacher Certification exam, $87 \%$ or more of UPRM graduates passed the specialization certification exams. Over the past three years 3 UPRM Social Science teacher candidates have taken the exam a total of 7 times. This means that in fact 47 of 56 ( $84 \%$ ) UPRM Secondary Social Science or History Teacher candidates have passed their certification exam. The low success rate in Social Science is a matter of concern to inform decision making to improve instruction.
That success rate has been closely correlated with adequate preparation in history. In collaboration with the URPM Department of Social Sciences, the TPP identified specific history courses that Social Science teacher candidates need to succeed on the certification exam. Since 2011, the UPRM TPP has required Social Science teacher candidates to complete these history courses before enrolling in Teaching Practice.

## Puerto Rico Teacher Specialization Certification Exam Results 2014-2016

Historically, the highest score on 1 to 4 Puerto Rico Specialization Teacher Certification exams has been made by a UPRM teacher candidate each year. This year UPRM teacher candidates made the highest scores on the Mathematics, English, and Spanish Specialization Exams. Last year two UPRM teacher candidates tied for the top score on the Mathematics Specialization exam. Given that UPRM teacher candidates account for 5-20\% of the test takers for any one specialization exam, this attests to the breadth and depth of their preparation in licensure area content. The following table includes the top ${ }^{\top}$ scores by URPM candidates for the past three years.
Until 2016, the CollegeBoard ${ }^{\circledR}$ institutional report on Puerto Rico's Teacher Certification Exams did not include the median, minimum or maximum scores for the institution. In those cases an estimate ${ }^{e}$ is provided. The estimate is deduced from the individual scores released in the report. Most ( $90 \%$ or more), but not all, UPRM teacher candidates allow CollegeBoard ${ }^{\circledR}$ to release their scores to UPRM. So there is a good basis for these estimates.
