Executive Summary

The Department of Economics offers a four-year program leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts in Economics. The program is one of only two undergraduate programs in Economics offers within the University of Puerto Rico (UPR) system. The program offers a strong development in quantitative methods and techniques necessary for economic analysis by requiring two-semester sequence in mathematics, one year of mathematical statistics, one semester in project evaluation and one semester course in econometrics, as well as one year seminar course in research methodology.

Besides providing professional training to students majoring in Economics, the Department also offers a Minor Concentration in Economics, mainly design for student's pursuing other fields in the UPRM with an interest in complementing its career development with a knowledge in economics.

The Department educational purpose is to develop students' ability to think clearly and objectively in dealing with economic decisions and problems. Students are trained specifically to replace value judgments and prejudices with sound economic reasoning based on an objective and rational analysis. Besides this function, economic research and the promotion of economic education are two integral elements within the Department.

In this context, the Department vision is to become an advanced department in higher education and research, internationally distinguished for its excellence in the training of its graduates, which contributes dynamically to social and economic development, transforming society through the pursuit of knowledge, in an environment of ethics, justice, and peace.


In addition, its mission seeks to provide an excellence service in education, particularly:

- Collaborating in the formation of educated, cultured citizens, capable of critical thinking and professionally prepared in the economic discipline so that they can contribute to educational, cultural, social, technological and economic development.
- Carrying out creative work, research, and service, that meets the needs of society and disseminating the results of these activities so that they are accessible to all.
- To provide our students with the skills and sensitivity necessary to effectively solve
 the problems we face and to be an example of the civic formation in education that
 must prevail in a democratic system that values and respects diversity.

To accomplish these statements, the Department of Economics has a total of eight (8) professors of which seven (7) are in the rank of professor, and one with the rank of associate professor. In addition, the Department expected to have a new faculty member effective July 1, 2025. The Department has a Faculty Recruitment Plan reviewed and approved at a departmental meeting on Thursday, December 1, 2016. As for the

administrative staff, apart from the position of Director of the Department there are three (3) non-teaching employees, these are: an administrative officer, an administrative secretary, and a coordinator of technical service coordinator to the user.

The Department is located in the Efrain Sánchez Hidalgo Building, occupying its administrative offices on the third floor of the building. In addition to that the Department has five classrooms, one computer lab, two meeting rooms, thirteen professor offices, one storage area, and other offices.



During the academic year 2024-2025 several activities, initiatives and accomplishments were carried out to support the UPRM institutional objectives.

In the assessment area, a departmental assessment plan was revised and approved, and two different questionnaires were put into effect. The questionnaires were: (1) questionnaire was distributed to the freshman economics students in the orientation and welcome day; and (2) An *Exit Questionnaire* was carried out to receive the perspective of the economics senior students. In addition, three separate reports were discussed at the departmental faculty meeting about the academic profile of (1) the Department's freshman class 2024-2025, (2) academic profile of all active students in the Bachelor of Arts in Economics Program, and (3) In the Second Semester 2024-2025, the results of

the Administrative Appraisal Questionnaire for the First Semester 2024-2025 were reported at the departmental meeting on Thursday, March 6, 2025. The vision, mission, objectives, and values of the Center for Economic and Financial Education (CEEF) were reviewed, and updated on Friday, January 31, 2025. These were subsequently approved at the departmental faculty regular meeting on Thursday, February 6, 2025. The process of visiting the classrooms of the Department of Economics for the administration of the Student Opinion Questionnaire (COE) was reestablished with the assistance of the departmental faculty staffs as part of the recommendation approved in Certification No. 24-25-067 of the Administrative Board of the UPRM. On Thursday, March 6, 2025, the faculty of the Department of Economics in the ordinary meeting approved the proposed alignment of the Expected Learning Outcomes of General Education of the UPRM with the Expected Student Learning Outcomes of the Bachelor of Arts in Economics Program (SLOs ECON). The proposed revision of the alignment of ECON SLOs with those of the College of Arts and Sciences was also approved. Dr. Carlos A. del Valle González, Professor of the Department of Economics, was appointed (by the Chancellors' Office) for the special assignment of preparing and drafting the UPRM Infrastructure Master Plan 2024-2034. In addition, professor del Valle organized collaborative planning roundtables on the UPR Master Plan.

In the curriculum area, the proposal for the creation of a master's program in sustainable economic development and its initial courses were approved by the department and submitted to the faculty curriculum committee. All proposed courses in the master's program in sustainable economic development were approved by the faculty curriculum committee. The courses of the master's degree have already been approved at the level of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences. The prerequisites for the courses ECON 4056 (Environmental Economics) and ECON 4028 (Natural Resource Economics) were revised and modified at the departmental faculty ordinary meeting held on Thursday, March 6, 2025. The faculty of the Department of Economics in a regular meeting held on Thursday, March 6, 2025 approved the proposed curricular change to eliminate the prerequisites of the following ECON coding courses, these are ECON 3086: Contemporary Problems of the Economy of Puerto Rico, ECON 4028: Economics of Natural Resources, ECON 4047: Economics of Electronic Commerce and the Internet, ECON 4056: Economics of the Environment and ECON 4068: Economics of Tourism.

In the administrative area, the Department continues its efforts in the digitization of its archives to liberalize storage space and the implementation of technology to provide a service of excellence.

In the funding and research area, some faculty members have participated as co-principal investigators in several research proposals for external funding with other UPRM institutional units, such as the Department of Civil Engineering, the College of Business Administration, the Department of Social Sciences, among others. The Department also participated in the RUMex program offering ECON courses which represents a newly diversified funds of revenue. The Department of Economics published Volume 11 of our journal Ceteris Paribus. Dr. Vanee Smit was very helpful with his recommendations for institutionalizing the journal. Following its recommendations, an ISSN was obtained and

for the first time each article in the journal has its own DOI. Ceteris Paribus is expected to be included as part of CePa's virtual catalog. In addition, a second collaboration agreement was signed with the Puerto Rico Planning Board to provide technical assistance in the production of the national accounts and the input-output matrix. In the area of community services and societal impact, the faculty participated continuously in several conferences, discussion panels, meetings that provided an important point of view. Some of our faculty members also collaborated with other governmental agencies, such as the Department of Justice of Puerto Rico, the Puerto Rico Planning Board, and the municipality of Mayaguez.

In the area of international activity Dr. Ricardo R. Fuentes Ramírez informed the publication "Counter-Hegemonic Evolution: The intentional township of Auroville as a case study of Systemic Transformation" conditionally accepted in the peer-reviewed journal "Review of Radical Political Economics" was co-authored with sociologist Cansu Gurkaya attached to the Center for Indian and South Asian Studies -CEIAS of the École des Hautes Études in Social Sciences in France. The work presented in New York City. at the 51st Annual Conference - Eastern Economic Association on February 22, 2025 was also co-authored with sociologist Cansu Gurkaya. In addition, Dr. Ricardo R. Fuentes Ramírez and Dr. Jeffry Valentín Mari were invited by the Rector's Office to participate on Monday, March 31, 2025 in a working group (Celis-202) to explore possible collaborations in economic development, entrepreneurship and regional impact initiatives with faculty from Purdue University Northwest who were on view at the Campus from March 31 to April 1, 2025. Al so, Dr. Dahil R. Colón Arbelo, Assistant Professor at the Department of Economics participated in the International Congress VII of the Association of Economic History of the Caribbean. The following sections presented, aligned with the institutional annual report, the initiatives, activities, and accomplishments carried out by the Department of Economics during the academic year 2024-2025.

To institutionalize a culture of strategic planning and assessment.

 Dr. Carlos A. Del Valle González, professor at the Department of Economics, was appointed as a member of the Arts and Sciences Planning Committee, institutional committee in charge of the new strategic plan of the College of Arts and Sciences at UPRM.

- Dr. Ricardo R. Fuentes Ramírez, associate professor at the Department of Economics, implemented at the Department level an online administrative assessment questionnaire.
- On Thursday, October 24, 2024, the Economics Department Administrative Assessment Questionnaire for the period comprising the Academic Year 2024-2025 was delivered to the faculty staff of the Department of Economics. The Questionnaire is part of the work programmed by the Assessment Committee during the academic year. The information that is completed in the questionnaire is anonymous. The link to the questionnaire was sent to the institutional email of the Departmental faculty staff. The questionnaire platform was available at Google Forms, which had a completed deadline of Friday, November 22, 2024 until 4:30 pm.
- On Thursday, September 5, 2024, at the Departmental ordinary faculty meeting, the faculty staff of the Department of Economics was asked to verify the following information: (1) Date of recruitment at the UPRM, (2) Academic degrees obtained (year, degree and university), (3) ECON Taught Courses and (4) Areas of Specialty and Research. Justification: This type of information is frequently requested from the departmental management for the purpose of completing forms related to the accreditation or institutional evaluation processes (i.e., MSCHE, fiveyear evaluations and licensing of the Board of Postsecondary Institutions, among others).
- On Thursday, September 5, 2024, at the Departmental ordinary faculty meeting, the Personnel Evaluation Plan for the Faculty Staff of the Department of Economics was distributed among the faculty staff. At that moment, Dr. Ricardo R. Fuentes Ramírez was the faculty member pending periodic evaluations by the Departmental Personnel Committee. In addition, the current operational criteria for faculty evaluation of the Department were delivered to the faculty staff. This includes the Appendix F: Module for General Evaluation and Appendix G: Module for Teaching Evaluation. On that day, the teaching staff was informed through a departmental communication about the revision of these criteria's, including the criteria's presented in the Appendix I.
- On Thursday, October 3, at the Departmental ordinary faculty meeting, a
 departmental report was distributed among the faculty members of the Department
 of Economics that presents the academic profile of the 29 active students in the
 Bachelor of Arts in Economics Program.
- On Thursday, November 7, 2024, at the Departmental ordinary faculty meeting, the percentage distribution of the preliminary grades obtained by the 2024-2025 freshman students of the Bachelor of Arts in Economics Program was presented to the faculty staff. The information presented is based on the report of grades delivered by the Registry Office of the UPRM under the institutional initiative of the Early Warning System.
- Dr. Carlos A. del Valle González, Professor of the Department of Economics, was appointed (by the Chancellors' Office) for the special assignment of preparing and

- drafting the UPRM Infrastructure Master Plan 2024-2034. In addition, professor del Valle organized collaborative planning roundtables on the UPR Master Plan.
- On Wednesday, August 14, 2024, at the first meeting of directors of the College of Arts and Sciences, the Dean of Arts and Sciences asked the directors that the departmental Personnel Committees begin the work to prepare the plans for the recruitment of teaching staff, specifically the areas of hiring (with the corresponding justifications). This is in case such information is requested for the UPRM Recruitment Plan 2025-2026. The University of Puerto Rico, Mayagüez Campus (UPRM), has gone through the following recruitment cycles (these plans were distributed to faculty):
 - 2020 Recruitment Plan: Assigns a teaching position to the Department of Economics.
 - 2021 Recruitment Plan: Does not assign a teaching position to the Department of Economics.
 - 2023 Recruitment Plan: Assigns a teaching position to the Department of Economics.
- The Annual Report of the Department of Economics for the 2024-2025 Academic Year was summitted on June 25, 2025 to the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, with the deadline for delivery being July 1, 2025.
- The master syllabus (in face-to-face mode) of all ECON undergraduate coding courses were updated according to the Certification No. 125 (2023-2024) of the Board of Governors of the University of Puerto Rico (JG-UPR) and are available for use on the website of the Department of Economics in https://www.uprm.edu/economia/prontuarios/.
- On Thursday, September 5, 2024, at the Departmental ordinary faculty meeting, a report was delivered to the faculty staff presenting the answers to the questionnaire distributed to the seven (7) 2024-2025 freshman students who enrolled and attended the Department's welcome and orientation on Thursday, August 2, 2024.
- On Thursday, September 5, 2024, at the Departmental ordinary faculty meeting, a report presenting the academic profile of the 2024-2025 freshman students of the Department of Economics was delivered and discussed among the faculty staff.
- Economics Department faculty staff (i.e., Dr. Ivonne Diaz Rodriguez and Jeffry Valentin Mari) participated in the event titled Collaborative Planning Roundtables for the Development of the UPR Master Plan, organized by Dr. Daniel Rodríguez and Dr. Carlos del Valle on March 27 and 28, 2025.
- In the Second Semester 2024-2025, the results of the Administrative Appraisal Questionnaire for the First Semester 2024-2025 were reported at the departmental meeting on Thursday, March 6, 2025. At the faculty level, work continued for the publication of the next volume of Assessment Plus.
- In the Second Semester 2024-2025, Dr. Eduardo Kicinski, professor at the Department of Economics, prepared data collection for an appraisal project, where

differences in students' final grades from the ECON 3021 course are analyzed, given differences in the number of absences and whether they took the LWV course sequence versus MJ course sequence.

- In an ordinary meeting of the Department of Economics held on Thursday, February 6, 2025, a table was distributed to the faculty staff showing the Expected Learning Outcomes of General Education at UPRM, as well as the Learning Objectives of the Bachelor of Arts Program in Economics and the Expected Learning Outcomes of the Bachelor of Arts in Economics Student. The faculty staff was asked to verify the alignment of the expected learning outcomes and objectives of the Bachelor of Arts in Economics Program with those of the College of Arts and Sciences and those of the UPRM.
- On Wednesday, February 5, 2025 at 9:00 am at Celis 116, the meeting of the Rector with the academic programs of the UPRM affected by the Series R-2425-17 was held. On January 30, 2025, the departmental report required by Series R-2425-17 regarding the evaluation of the Bachelor of Arts Program in Economics was distributed among the teaching staff of the Department of Economics.
- The vision, mission, objectives, and values of the Center for Economic and Financial Education (CEEF) were reviewed, and updated on Friday, January 31, 2025. These were subsequently approved at the departmental faculty regular meeting on Thursday, February 6, 2025.
- The Bachelor of Arts in Economics Program Student Recruitment Plan was presented and approved at the departmental faculty regular meeting on Thursday, February 6, 2025. The Plan consists of three areas: (1) Participate in the 4th edition of the College of Arts and Sciences' Summer Camp: Explore Your Vocation in the Arts and Sciences. Around 100 students in grades 11 and 12 from schools throughout Puerto Rico are expected to participate. The Camp will be held at the UPRM from June 23 to 27, 2025; (2) School Visits: Professor Dahil Colón Arbelo reported that she plans to visit the San Felipe de Arecibo School and the Captain Correa Evangelical School in Hatillo on Friday, February 21 in the morning; (3) Collaborative Pilot Plan with the Department of Education. On Friday, January 31, 2025, a meeting was held with Mr. Víctor M. Cintrón Díaz of the Assistant Secretary of Academic Services of the Social Studies Program of the Puerto Rico Department of Education (DEPR) and Ms. Jesselia Ayala Torres, Facilitator of the Social Studies Program of the Mayagüez Educational Region of the PRDE. It was agreed to offer an initial training workshop in Basic Principles in Economics to 40 teachers of the Social Studies Program on Friday, April 11, 2025 from 8:00 am to 12 noon at the UPRM. This initiative will help to create the necessary contact with teachers and facilitate visits to schools in the public education system.
- Dr. Carlos A. del Valle González, Professor, participates at the request of the Office of Planning, Research and Institutional Improvement (OPIMI) in the process of updating the Master Plan of the University of Mayagüez Campus (RUM). 

- The master records of all ECON coding course (at undergraduate level) were reviewed following the current regulations of the records is Certification No. 125 (2023-2024) Governing Board (JG) of the UPR, Guide for the Creation, Uniform Coding and Registration of Courses, which amends Certification No. 33 (2020-2021) JG. This new certification came into force in August 2024. Master handbooks for the courses in the Department of Economics are available at https://www.uprm.edu/economia/prontuarios/
- The Dean of Academic Affairs of the Campus reported the approval of the request of the Department of Economics on the inactivation of the following ECON coding courses, these are: ECON 4007: Quantitative Methods in Economics, ECON 4046: Input-Output Analysis and ECON 4405: Contemporary Economic Problems. These courses have not been offered for more than five (5) years.
- The faculty of the Department of Economics approved in an ordinary meeting on Thursday, April 3, 2025 that new students of the Academic Year 2025-2026 be enrolled in the sequence of new courses ESPA 3131 and ESPA 3132.
- On Thursday, April 3, 2025, in an ordinary meeting of the Department of Economics, the academic information of the Department was approved, which will be published in the 2025-2026 Undergraduate Catalog.
- On March 21, 2025, the Department of Economics appointed Dr. Ricardo R. Fuentes Ramírez, Associate Professor, to collaborate in the development of the Campus' Chatbot project aimed at new students and it is expected to be available by May 2025. The immediate tasks are to identify documents or web pages that contain relevant information about the academic programs, as well as to generate questions with their respective answers for the training of the Chatbot.


 The faculty of the Department of Economics in a regular meeting held on Thursday, March 6, 2025 approved the proposed curricular change to eliminate the prerequisites of the following ECON coding courses, these are ECON 3086: Contemporary Problems of the Economy of Puerto Rico, ECON 4028: Economics of Natural Resources, ECON 4047: Economics of Electronic Commerce and the Internet, ECON 4056: Economics of the Environment and ECON 4068: Economics of Tourism.

To increase and diversify the Institution's sources of revenue.

- Dr. Ricardo R. Fuentes Ramírez, continued the collaboration with government state funds from the Puerto Rico Planning Board for technical assistance to the agency. This includes funds for students, who have benefited from the project.
- The Department of Economics continued with the corresponding procedure to acquire three (3) desktop computers (PC Desktops) for the teaching staff for the amount of \$3,417.00. These funds were assigned from the RUMex revolving account of the allocation corresponding to the First Semester 2023-2024. At the moment the departmental directorate is waiting if we are assigned from the Budget Office the necessary funds to acquire the remaining computers.
- The Department of Economics allocated a total of \$2,770.00 of its own funds available from RUMex (\$1,953.77) and CEEF (\$816.23) to cover the cost of acquiring the two glass doors in the room at SH-307 that were not considered in the petition that was delivered to the Budget Office.



• The amount of \$27,908.00 was allocated to the Department of Economics from technology fee funds corresponding to the 2024-2025 Academic Year. The amount allocated is intended to replace the current virtual terminal network with 26 Dell OptiPlex Tower Plus 7010 Base Model PCs that will be available in the computer lab at SH-301 and for the purchase of two (2) units of Dell OptiPlex Tower Plus 7010 Basic Model PCs to replace two current units located in two classrooms.



- The amount of \$10,958.86 of RUMex funds corresponding to the Second Semester 2023-2024 was allocated. With which, 2 additional computers were acquired for teaching staff, as well as 5 cameras and 5 speakers for teachers with new equipment. In addition to office materials, promotional material and in support of the Association of Economics Students, with these funds a tablecloth will be processed that identifies the association for the activities they carry out. We are in the process of identifying future departmental needs for the use of these.
- Professor Dahil Colón Arbelo, Instructor, participates as a co-investigator in the project entitled Technical Assistance in the Production of the Quarterly Accounts of the Gross Product and the Output Input Matrix 2017" (Z-410) of the Planning Board of Puerto Rico. Additional compensation: 3 credits.
- Dr. Ricardo R. Fuentes Ramírez, Associate Professor, participated in the following research projects: Technical Assistance in the Production of the Quarterly Accounts of the Gross Product and the 2017 Output Input Matrix (Z-410) of the Planning Board of Puerto Rico. Regular Assignment: 3 credits. It receives discharge for research as part of the commitments made in its effective hiring on July 1, 2021. Regular Assignment: 3 credits.

To implement efficient and expedient administrative procedures.

- Dr. Ricardo R. Fuentes Ramírez, associate professor at the Department of Economics, implemented at the Department level an online administrative assessment questionnaire.
- The Department continues its efforts to digitize documents in order to liberalize storage space. The administrative office has limited space for document archiving purposes (i.e., the warehouse on SH-305D and the area near the photocopier located on SH-302A). The Digitization Plan has been governed by Certification No. 62 (2015-2016) of the Board of Governors (JG) of the University of Puerto Rico (UPR), as amended that approves the Regulations for the Administration, Conservation and Disposition of Documents of the University of Puerto Rico. The digitization process has been carried out since the First Semester of the 2019-2020 Academic Year (see Director's Report delivered at the ordinary meeting of Thursday, October 24, 2019 and Minutes 19-20-03). Up to this point, documents from the 1980s and 1990s have been digitized. As for the 2000s, it has been completed up to the 2004-2005 Academic Year.
