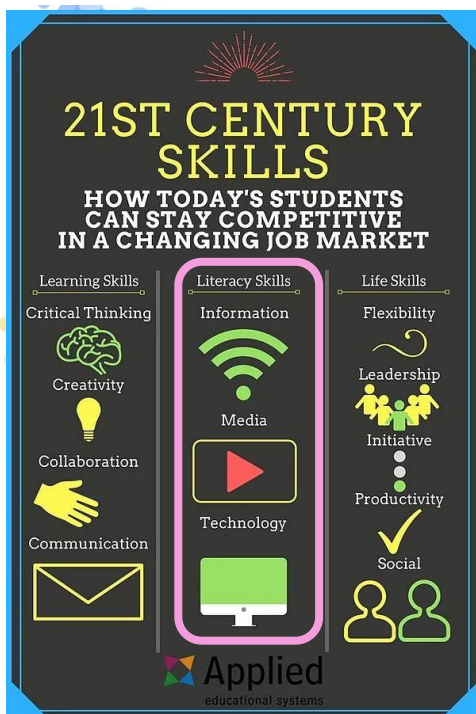

 - Understanding facts, figures, statistics, and data.
- **Media literacy**
 - Understanding the methods and outlets in which information is published.
- **Technology literacy**
 - Understanding the machines that make the Information Age possible.

INFORMATION LITERACY

Information literacy is the set of integrated abilities encompassing the reflective discovery of information, the understanding of how information is produced and valued, and the use of information in creating new knowledge and participating ethically in communities of learning (Association of College and Research Libraries, 2015).

Authority Is Constructed and Contextual	Information Creation as a Process
Information Has Value	Research as Inquiry
Scholarship as Conversation	Searching as Strategic Exploration

DESCRIPTION

Online plagiarism detection service tool that helps determine the originality of texts by comparing documents against millions of published works available through the Internet and library databases.

It generates a report of the percentage of similarity and provides links to those specific sources.

DESCRIPTION

File Requirements

- ✓ Files must be less than 40MB.
- ✓ The maximum document length is 400 pages.
- ✓ Files must contain at least 20 words of text.
- ✓ Files must not exceed 2MB of raw text.
- ✓ Zip files may contain up to 200MB or 1,000 files

JSTOR is a multidisciplinary database. It covers over 60 different subject areas including: Business, Biology, Botany, Economics, History, Philosophy, Film Studies, Literature, and Astronomy among others. Our CASI has been added to the previous collection of the Titles of the Language & Literature collection. Please note that JSTOR collections are comprised of the complete sets of journals with an average of the most recent 10-15 years.
