Estimado señor Presidente:

Ha culminado el proceso de consulta para la designación del **Decano de Artes y Ciencias** del Recinto Universitario de Mayagüez de la Universidad de Puerto Rico y al recibir los informes de los comités del personal docente y del no-docente, procedo a someter a usted mis recomendaciones. La selección de los comités de consulta se realizaron según el Reglamento de la Universidad de Puerto Rico. Le informo, además, que he entrevistado personalmente al recomendado.

El comité de consulta inició sus labores el 15 de octubre de 2014 y sometió su informe final el 24 de noviembre de 2014. El comité preparó un perfil del Decano(a) de la Facultad que incluía los requisitos mínimos que debía cumplir el candidato(a) además de una lista con deberes y responsabilidades que el comité entendía eran indispensables.

Se recibieron nominaciones para veintiún (21) candidatos. De ellos sólo aceptaron el Dr. Héctor Huyke del Departamento de Humanidades, la Dra. Nilda Aponte del Departamento de Biología del Recinto de Bayamón de la Universidad de Puerto Rico, el Dr. Alfredo Morales del Departamento de Estudios Hispánicos y la Dra. Marla Pérez Lugo del Departamento de Ciencias Sociales. Posteriormente, el Dr. Manuel Valdés Pizzini, quién había declinado la nominación antes de la fecha límite, reconsideró y aceptó la nominación. Luego, el Dr. Héctor Huyke retiró su candidatura mediante comunicación electrónica.

El Comité de Consulta recomendó unánimemente al Dr. Manuel Valdés Pizzini. Entendiendo que él tiene todos los elementos y la capacidad necesaria para ocupar el puesto de Decano de Artes y Ciencias.

El doctor Valdés Pizzini realizó estudios de grado en antropología y sociología en el Recinto de Río Piedras de la Universidad de Puerto Rico y su posgrado (MA y PhD) en antropología en la Universidad del Estado de Nueva York (SUNY). El claustral es profesor en el Recinto

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
