Introduction

Area-E is part of the Business and Economic Development Center (BEDC) of the University of Puerto Rico Mayaguez Campus (RUM) and consists of an incubator and an accelerator program for small businesses funded by the CDBG-DR and administered by Department of Housing, offered completely free of charge. The main purpose of the program is to support those businesses that have been affected by hurricanes Irma and María or those who arose from a need or idea due to these natural disasters. In addition, the program seeks to meet the national objective of the CDBG-DR program to promote the development of low-to-moderate income sectors, as well as companies that are women and minority owned. The ultimate objective is to promote the economic growth of Puerto Rico through the development of viable and sustainable small businesses.

The incubation and acceleration programs provide support to businesses in order to strengthen and grow the companies throughout their different stages. The program offers, but is not limited to:

- workshops
- mentoring
- technical assistance
- networking



The program activities are focused to accomplish three mayor key indicators:

- 1) **outreach efforts** capture all outreach efforts to socialize the program and includes all pertinent information to inform the public about the program
- 2) **business engagement activities** capture any engagement with businesses and potential businesses who sign up and begin the program
- 3) **completion of the program** captures information related to the completion of the small business incubator and accelerator program and improvement of business ability.

Additional program information:

• Area-E currently has 15 intern students working for the program, from which 3 are graduate students. The students come from diverse academic programs including Accounting, Finance, Human Resources, Marketing, Mechanical, Industrial, and Electrical Engineering. They provide direct service to clients, develop networking activities, and assist with administrative tasks. The budget projected for intern student wages during the second year was \$100,588.

Outreach

From March 2022 to March 2023, Area-E's marketing team has executed **922 outreach activities** (including posts on social media (Facebook, Instagram and LinkedIn), info sessions, etc.), has produced **176 outreach materials** (art created, such as, banners and flyers), and has reached **216,927 individuals or potential business**.

Area-E has received a total of **266 applications** (service requests) for the reporting period. From this total, **91** service requests were received for **Cohort 2** and **110** for **Cohort 3**. For Cohort 2, a group of **83** businesses started the **incubation** program in **August 2022** and **62** business started the **acceleration** program in **October 2022**. For Cohort 3, a group of **68** businesses started the **incubation** program in **February 2022**. Each cohort has a duration of approximately one year. The first 6 months consist of workshops (incubation and acceleration), one-one mentoring sessions and networking activities. The other 6 months include specialized technical assistance to the businesses.







Business Island Distribution










The following graphs show the location, type of business distribution and women owned businesses who are currently participating in Cohort 3.

Mentoring

The program currently offers thematic or subject mentoring, which is limited to a specific topic related to the workshops offered. There are **20 internal mentors**, which include intern students of Area-E and UPRM staff and professors. For Cohort 2, our mentors provided more than **63 hours of one-on-one mentoring** in their different areas of specialization, under the supervision of our administrative staff. In addition, as part of the program, the staff has continued to develop educational materials (templates, guides, and manuals), regarding the topics of the workshops. These educational materials are shared with the program participants.

Technical Assistance

Technical assistance is additional counseling and consulting that extends beyond mentoring and seeks to help entrepreneurs in specific areas of their business. Only businesses that successfully complete the educational and mentoring program can benefit from technical assistance. Technical Assistance is carried out by our internal professors and external specialists that are under contract to offer their professional services directly to provide solutions to resolve the challenges faced by the businesses within a controlled time set. For Cohort 1, 16 specialists provided technical assistance from which 3 were external. Our specialists provided more than 160 hours of one-on-one meetings of technical assistance.

Seed Funds

Participants who successfully completed the program had the opportunity to apply for seed funds provided by Banco Popular de Puerto Rico (BPPR) which aimed to provide financial support to small businesses who want to strengthen or expand their business. From Cohort 1, five participants received \$5,000 and from Cohort 2, 12 participants received \$5,000 in seed funds. In addition, 30 participants from Cohorts 1, 2, and 3 received a small cash grant of \$500 as emergency funds for businesses affected by hurricane Fiona.



Networking

Networking activities have been held, providing participants the opportunity to meet and connect with other entrepreneurs, mentors, staff members, and other entities that provide services to small businesses.

Business Expo 2022

The I&E Week took place during the first week of May 2022, where workshops were offered to entrepreneurs and the academic community. The I&E Week concluded with the Business Expo, where more than 40 businesses and entities registered to showcase and offer their services and/or products to students and other entrepreneurs.
