#### **Narrative**

The Business & Economic Development Center (BEDC), a University Center (UC) at the University of Puerto Rico, Mayagüez campus (UPRM), as part of the Caribbean Regional UC completed all the tasks in our scope of work: job creation (45), job retention (170), and its investment (\$658,950) and the UVI-CELL at University of Virgin Island (UVI) with job creation (3), job retention (35) and its investment (\$76,075). The Caribbean Regional UC proposes to provide specific activities through the BEDC at UPRM, and UVI-CELL, which includes, providing technical assistance, conducting applied research and dissemination as part of the economic development activities. Three mayor categories of innovation activities proposed are: 1) technical assistance to innovators and existing businesses;2) applied research through allied centers and courses, and 3) dissemination of all activities that impact economic development in the region. Regarding the direct service to client the BEDC during this period received 82 new service solicitations for a total of 171 in the year. We provided more than 99 hours of one-on-one assistance. In this period, a group of 30 intern students, with 23 graduate students among them, offered technical assistance in their different areas of specialization to businesses, under the supervision of our mentor's professors and business specialists according to the programs that are assigned. The BEDC continues as the hub of the UPRM E-Ship Network. As an ecosystem builder we support all the efforts to expand the entrepreneurial ecosystem in the region. Our more closed partners are the NSF I-Corps Site UPRM, Echar Pa'Lante of Banco Popular, RISE Program of the Bravo Family Foundation (an accelerator), Perspectivas Globales (an incubator), Parallel 18, and Colmena 66 of the Puerto Rico Science, Technology and Research Trust (PRTRUST). Additionally, we are working with several NPO and private organizations to advance the economic development in the region through the NPO SIED program. To advance our goals we continue with the Incubator and Accelerator (Area-E) program. Now the formal educational program and mentoring process of Área-E finished the 4th cohort of acceleration and now are in the 4th cohort of incubation, as a complementary program of the UPRM-UC. It is important to mention that the model developed to manage Área-E program was submitted to the UEDA Summit 2024 and was selected as a finalist in the innovation category, which we were finally honored to win in Utah.



#### Beyond these completed tasks and assignments, the BEDC would like to highlight the following:

- A group of students led by the Industrial Engineering Dr. Lourdes Medina constitute our **BEDC Improvement Team**. The group developed a series of workshops and activities to promote a culture of continuing improvement between all the staff including professors, undergraduate and graduate students. During this period 4 trainings were provided, for a total of **9 trainings** during the year and **3 Kaizen events.** were done. Trainings includes the new Customer Relationship Management (CRM) tool, Basecamp as a Project Management tool, effective communication written and speaking, and the 5'S for Google Drive, among others.
- The Non-Profit Organizations Strengthening Initiative for Economic Development (NPO-SIED), has provided mentoring and technical assistance to over **20 nonprofit organizations** in **almost 1.5 years** of program. To that end, **11 graduate internship students** and **1 undergraduate student** from UPR Mayagüez have been trained during this period by the project's Professors, so they can provide the technical assistance to each organization. The performance period for this project is 2 years, until June 2024.
- Additionally, the BEDC personnel participated in more than 9 professional development training on subjects related to
  the center's services including business tranformation, exporting, and innovation. On August 31, Dr. De Hoyos, Dr.
  Zapata and Dr. Lugo participated as panelists in the Boricua Emprende Fest by Colmena 66, as part of the
  entrepreneurial ecosystems movement.
- We continue updating our webpage, adding resources such as webinars to our potential clients and current entrepreneurs.
- The magazine developed by a group of students called the <u>UPRM E-ship Network La Revista</u>, is currently in its **thirteenth volume**. Under the statement of "*Neuromarketing is the Happy Marriage between Neuroscience and Marketing*" as an innovative tool for business success for entrepreneurs and potential entrepreneurs.
- We provided more than **59.5 hours of training** open to the community throughout different events to more of **911** participants.

The University of the Virgin Islands as a subawardee provide service through the UVI CELL. UVI CELL focus on providing quality training opportunities and resources designed to contribute to organizational and individual achievement. The UVI CELL in collaboration with the Small Business Development Center, which is also hosted by UVI, the UVI School of Business Entrepreneurship Program, SCORE Business Mentoring and GCSEN Caribe (Global Center for Social Entrepreneurship Network) and the Office of Veterans Affairs have impacted 25 entrepreneurs during this period. These small businesses received mentorship, formal education, one on one coaching and access to online webinars.

## As part of the US Caribbean Regional Proposal for Innovation & Business Development the University of Virgin Island-CELL reported:

- Twenty five (25) small USVI businesses and three (3) potential entrepreneurs from the USVI Bureau of Corrections, went through 6 months of entrepreneur classes and mentorship/coaching services by the UVI CELL EDA University Center and their partners, GCSEN (Global Center for Social Entrepreneur Network). They also received access to unlimited SCORE webinars and each participant received an interactive workbook about entrepreneurship.
- Ten (10) entrepreneurs graduated from the GSCEN Social Entrepreneurship 102 course, where they were given access to coaching sessions, books/materials, and templates for pitch decks along with one on one coaching assistance to complete them. This group consisted of 2 startups and 8 existing businesses.
- UVI's partnership with the Office of Veterans Affairs had a huge impact on their first cohort, as such, that they offered a donation to extend the program to Veterans in the territory. 10 Veterans participated of the GCSEN 101 Social Entrepreneur Program.
- Attended several community events promoting the UVI program and their services.
- Continued to reach out to UVI auxiliary groups and related community groups on potential collaborations for the participants and supporters for the program.

All activities conducted to date by the BEDC at UPRM and UVI-Cell have benefited our distressed and underserved community. All participating businesses are low income and minority-owned who have been traditionally underserved.

#### MiUni



MiUni started as an idea to help students adapt and enjoy life in college through the use of an application that carries all the essentials they might need. Its creator, William Flores, a Software Engineering sophomore student at UPRM, has already developed the beta version and it is set to launch on November 3, 2023. In it, everyone will find information regarding student associations, restaurants, bars, dorms, and sports in the Mayagüez area. The app also includes a GPS which identifies important places and routes commonly used by students.

The BEDC continue as a hub of the *UPRM E-ship Network* serving as a role models to the other campuses and organizations in the process of strengthening and developing their I&E Ecosystem. We still collaborate with projects related to CDBG-DR grants, such as CRECEN and Finca Explora (PRTEC). We continue leveraging our impact on Puerto Rico's west side, through collaboration with programs such as Creative Startups and Mercado Colegial, among others. In the case of UVI-CELL they work closely with the SBDC VI, GCSEN, Veteran Affair and SCORE to complement the program.

### Challenges and Mitigation

For the BEDC are still working with the administration to overcome the challenges at the accounting office to stay the invoicing and other financing things updated. Dr. De Hoyos agreed assist them through our administrative officer who help them in the reconciliation process and other reports. For UVI-CELL the biggest challenge are the additional funds need it to paid the personnel for the continuity of the program.
