Narrative

The Business & Economic Development Center (BEDC), a University Center at the University of Puerto Rico, Mayagüez campus, as part of the Caribbean Regional UC completed all the tasks in our scope of work: job creation (9), job retention (6), and its investment (\$492,945) and the UVI-CELL at University of Virgin Island (UVI) with job created (5), job retention (25) and its investment (\$50,312.50) . The Caribbean Regional UC proposes to provide specific activities through the BEDC at UPRM, and the UVI-CELL, which includes, providing technical assistance, conducting applied research and dissemination as part of the economic development activities. Three mayor categories of innovation activities proposed are: 1) technical assistance to innovators and existing businesses; 2) applied research through allied centers and courses, and 3) dissemination of all activities that impact economic development in the region. Regarding the direct service to clients the BEDC during this period received 93 new service solicitations. We provided an approximately 59 hours of one-on-one assistance. A group of 31 intern students, with 15 graduate students among them, offered technical assistance in their different areas of specialization to businesses, under the supervision of our mentor's professors and business specialists. The BEDC continue as the hub of the UPRM E-Ship **Network**. As ecosystem builder we support all the efforts to expand the entrepreneurial ecosystem in the region. Our more close partners are the NSF I-Corps Site UPRM, Echar Pa'Lante of Banco Popular, Engine 4, PRIMEX, West Chamber of Commerce, Gravital Agency, Patent and Trademark Resource Center at UPRM, and Colmena 66 of the Puerto Rico Science, Technology and Research Trust (PRTRUST). Additionally, during this period the NPO-SIED Program finished after two (2) years, having assisted over forty (40) Non Profit Organizations. Also, in September 2024, begined the new EDA proposal, Post Award Grants Management Technical Assistance Program (PAGM-TAB) for next two (2) years. Finally, the \$200,000, granted by Banco Popular of Puerto Rico in the previous period for our Seed Fund program were received and distributed, impacting twenty-five (25) existing companies.

Beyond these completed tasks and assignments, we would like to highlight the following:

- Dr. Leila Marcano, a collaborator professor, continued for a third year proposal to Echar Pa'Lante Program at Banco Popular. During August to December 2024, the program provided seeded fund (\$5,000) to 25 of our existing companies with 3.5 years or more in operation.
- The CNDE Improvement Team, compose by students led by the Industrial Engineering Professor Lourdes Medina, developed a series of workshops and activities to promote a culture of continuing improvement between all the staff (professors, undergraduate and graduate students). During this period 3 capacitation's were provided, 1 Kaizen Event and 2 professional development training on subjects related to the center's services, for a total of 9 hours of training to the all the personnel.
- The magazine <u>UPRM E-ship Network La Revista</u>, developed by a group of students, is currently in its sixteenth volume. The main subject during this last volume was to offer people the opportunity to see the history the BEDC now that their fortieth anniversary is coming up.



As part of the US Caribbean Regional Proposal for Innovation & Business Development the University of Virgin Island-CELL reported:

- Successfully recruited 15 businesses throughout the USVI with the intentions of providing entrepreneurship, workforce development. Mostly existing business and few startups and ideas.
- During November to March, we have 7 group coaching sessions and 25 one-on-one coaching and mentoring.
- In January, UC researched a pilot program to have an entrepreneur art program.
- All activities conducted to date have benefited our distressed and underserved community. All participating businesses are low income and minority-owned who have been traditionally underserved.

Assisted companies received investments of \$200,000 (cash), and \$232,800 (in-kind), for a total of \$432,800. Those businesses retained 6 employees and created 9 new jobs. Two of those existing business, El Sión and Next Cycle Foods won a prizes of \$35,000 (\$25,000 and \$10,000, respectively) on Entreprize Competition to Grupo Guayacán. UVI-CELL 15 entrepreneurs and potential entrepreneurs received services with a UVI CELL consultants and the GCSEN Entrepreneur coaches to include aspects of marketing, funding request, program applications as well as technical assistance. 45 coaching sessions were made, from which the participants learned how to make pitch decks, business plans, marketing plan and the were given the opportunity to either built or update said documents.

It was founded y Luz Bonilla in 2016 and was recently awarded \$2,000 in the Intensive Gen.3 Demo Day Competion of Fase 1.

In February 2025, the UVI Center for Excellence in Leadership and Learning (UVI-CELL) opened a new CELL on the island of Saint John.





Challenges and Mitigation

The BEDC with 39 years of relationship with EDA, still working with the administration to overcome the challenges at the accounting office to stay the invoicing and other financing things updated. Dr. De Hoyos agreed assist them through our administrative officer who help them in the reconciliation process and other reports. For UVI-CELL the biggest challenge are the additional funds need to paid the personnel for the continuity of the program.



The BEDC continue as a hub of the *UPRM E-ship Network* serving as a role models to the other campuses and organizations in the process of strengthening and developing their I&E Ecosystem. During this period we continue supporting several allied programs such as the Engine 4, CFP of the "Resarch Grants Program", SBIR Comitte and "Phase I" of the PRSTRUST, I-Corps RUM, Guayacán, Pre18, Venturewell, Puerto Rico Manufacturing Extension, Patent and Trademark Resource Center at UPRM, among others. We still collaborate with projects related to CDBG-DR grants, such as CRECEN. We continue leveraging our impact on Puerto Rico's west side, through collaboration with programs such as West Chamber of Commerce, Mercado Colegial, among others. In the case of UVI-CELL they work closely with the GCSEN, Office of Veteran Affairs, Digital Lending Innovation.
