Evidence 2023.4.1.2: PCMAS Results

Evidence Overview

The evidence presented pertains to the UPRM Teacher Preparation Program and its dedication to preparing teachers who positively impact K-12 student learning. The program assesses its effectiveness by comparing annual data from the Teaching Certification Tests, known as PCMAS in Spanish, which are mandated by the Department of Education. This data is obtained from the College Board Report and is compared to data from previous years.

The primary purpose of this data analysis is to provide an overview of the program's graduates and the quality of preparation they receive within the UPRM Teacher Preparation Program. Successful completion of this program is a requirement for employment by the Department of Education of Puerto Rico to obtain teacher certification (as referenced in Evidence 2023.4.1.2).

The key finding from the data analysis is that graduates of the UPRM Teacher Preparation Program consistently achieve higher scores on the Teaching Certification Tests compared to the average population. This information demonstrates the program's success in producing well-prepared teachers who excel in the required certification assessments, suggesting that the program has a positive impact on the growth of K-12 student learning.

The Evidence

This evidence provided clearly establishes that our graduates have continuously demonstrated higher scores than the average population.

PCMAS General

The individual results report of the PCMAS General offers the score according to the level: Elementary Level Secondary Level. The score, which expresses performance on the test, is reported on a scale that ranges from a minimum score of 40 points to a maximum of 160. Table 5below summarizes the results obtained by the population that was examined in March 2021. In the first column of the table the score appears on a scale in intervals of 10 points and then the frequency (number of examinees) in each interval is offered.

The individual results report of the PCMAS General offers the score according to the level: Elementary Level Secondary Level. The score, which expresses performance on the test, is reported on a scale that ranges from a minimum score of 40 points to a maximum of 160. Table 5below summarizes the results obtained by the population that was examined in March 2021. In the first column of the table the score appears on a scale in intervals of 10 points and then the frequency (number of examinees) in each interval is offered.
