- d. Relate the nature of personality development and human behavior to the mental health of (individuals, families and groups) clients.
- e. Develop therapeutic relationship with individuals, families and groups in a variety of settings.
- f. Examine the roles of the professional nurse in the delivery of psychiatric mental health care.
- g. Utilize the nursing process in the ministration of client care.

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- h. Recognize and utilize the value of research findings in psychiatric-mental health nursing practice.
- i. Intervene effectively with individuals in crisis, and individuals with disruptive, disturbed, and disintegrative behavioral patterns.
- j. Apply concepts of the critical thinking process in a variety of settings.
