Steps to Conduct Case Studies:

- 1. Determine your research question/s
- 2. Select cases:
 - a. Decide if the case study is appropriate to address your question/s
 - b. Decide how many cases are appropriate (1? More than 1?)
- 3. Prepare to collect the data determine techniques for data collection and analysis
- 4. Collect data
- 5. Evaluate and analyze the data
- 6. Write the research report and present the findings

Case Study Help Guide.

Title /Authors	Do this at the end of your workonce you know what your findings are.
Actors	Identify who are the main actors in your findings/cases
Location	Define the physical location for your case, and the relevance to your study.
Environmental Condition	What type of environmental stressor was the case exposed to.
Narrative	What happened? Support with evidence (photos, etc.)
Lessons learned	What did the community learned out of the process of dealing with the environmental stressor?
Action courses	What did the community enacted to deal with the environmental stressor?
References	Indicate sources that support your findings.
